This is the last Will and Testament of the said Robert

of the said Robert of Peterborough in the County of Northampton Esquire first do give and bequeath unto my daughter in law Catherine Robson of Stroud in the County of Stroud and her assigns an annuity or yearly sum of ten pounds for the life to her issue from the day of my death and to be paid half yearly and a annuity to be paid on and payable out of the said estate but in no manner after the death and it is my will that as soon after my decease as conveniently may be that the sum of ten pounds may be sent to Mrs Catherine Robson above mentioned the above ten pounds not to be considered as part of the annuity of ten pounds a year but as a gift also desired that the said Catherine and her assigns and particularly her assigns of her annuity may be sent to my daughter in law Catherine Robson of Stroud in the County of Stroud and her assigns unto my wife Elizabeth Strana Drury and Louisa Drury daughters of my dear beloved Brother Daniel Drury now deceased and to Elizabeth Drury daughter of my late dear wife Elizabeth Strana Drury all my plate and silver mourning and evening linen excepted to be equally divided part and share alike to my wife Elizabeth Drury and all my good silver and table linen to be equally divided part and share alike to my wife Elizabeth Drury and my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury and my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury and my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury the remainder of my plate if not previously disposed of except a silver knife and fork which I bought for my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury and my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury as it is marked a I wish a proper chest if I am not under the necessity of disposing of my plate for the means of support I then leave it to be divided between my two daughters Elizabeth Drury and Louisa Drury to be equally divided to my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury and my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury the portrait of my dear father and mother I am enticed to an annuity or yearly sum of ten pounds for the life of me the said Robert Robson and the said Elizabeth Drury and the life of the longest liver of them now do hereby give and bequeath the same annuity unto my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury of Bartholomew Lane London and to my dear daughter Elizabeth Drury a daughter in law in the said Stroud and the survivors of them and the Executors or Administrators of either survivor upon trust and so and for the use of the said Elizabeth Drury and Elizabeth Drury until they shall attain the age of twenty one years or until their marriage which shall first happen and upon their attaining the said age of twenty one years or on their marriage I give and bequeath the said annuity and all my right and interest of and in the bond bearing the same unto the said Elizabeth Drury and her assigns absolutely and in law the said annuity should be redeemed and paid off at any time previous to the death of the said Elizabeth Drury and Elizabeth Drury should become entitled to receive the said annuity then I do hereby direct the said John Duff and Daniel Drury or the survivor of them or the Executors or Administrators of either survivor on receiving the amount or value of the sum at which the said annuity shall be repaid to lay out and invest the same in Government or mortgage security and to pay the dividends or interest thereof unto the said Elizabeth Drury and Elizabeth Drury until they shall attain the said age or marriage as aforesaid and on the happening of either event to transfer or assign the stock or principal money absolutely for their own use and otherwise by indenture bearing date the twentieth sixth day of April one thousand eight hundred and six made between George Robson my late husband deceased of the first part me the said Robert Robson the said Robert Robson of the second part and Daniel Drury and John Duff of the third part being the attachment made previous to and in contemplation of my marriage with the said George Robson and after seeing among other things that the said Robert Robson was then seized to me and my heirs of the estate or premises therein mentioned and upon treaty for the said marriage it was agreed that the same should be settled to the use and benefit to the persons and provisions therein mentioned it is therefore witnessed that in consideration of ten shillings to me in hand paid by the said Daniel Drury

This is the last Will and Testament of me Benjamin Rodgers of the Township of Brongston in the Parish of St. Andrew in the County of Salop being weak in body but of sound and disposing mind first commended my soul to God, then gave it and my body to be buried in a private and funeral manner at the direction of my Executors hereinafter named. I do give and direct all my just debts and funeral expences to be paid & give to my son Francis Rodgers upon trust all my movable & immovable goods and furniture Books Linnen Plate and all other my personal Estate and effects of what nature or kind soever to be employed and expended for the use intent and purpose of the support and comfort of this my dear wife Elizabeth Rodgers during the term of her natural life and for that purpose she is thereby empowered with her consent to sell or dispose of all or any part thereof at her discretion and after the death of my said dear wife to divide as equally as can be done either by mutual agreement or sale whatsoever may remain of the property above described between myself and this my dear wife for their own use and benefit that property to remain in the hands in my name as surviving Trustee only excepted until I do so be applied agreeable to the deeds and for the purposes for which they were entrusted to me and no other and lastly I make nominate constitute and appoint my said son Francis Rodgers sole Executor of this my Will and do hereby revoke and make void all former Wills by me made In witness whereof I have signed and sealed this my last Will and Testament with my hand and Seal this twentieth day of November one thousand eight hundred and twenty one Benjamin Rodgers Signed sealed published and declared by the Testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who at this request and in his presence have subscribed our names as Witnesses He Son - Wilme H Rich: Taylor
