them all that Building then and for many years back used as a Theatre for a Company of
Comedians called in or adjoining thereto a yard belonging to the said John Tillotson in the parish
of Saint Martin in the City of London with the Crown rottene the same stood with
the appurtenances to the said John Tillotson and John Tillotson clerk
thereunto and abovesame to my son until the said marriage should take effect and after the
remuneration thereof to the use of my son and his heirs and for such Estate and Estates
as I have and shall have Robson notwithstanding my decease or death to be sole or
joint by my last will and Testament to be executed by the next present of them or most
valuable thinges thereon given him or her appurtenant where unto the said George Robson in
presence of such person to me shown and recited in and by the said instrument
affidavit do say that my last will and Testament attested in the present of the true
probate person witness names are taken in divers and sundry places divers
and affidavit all that the said Theatre of Buildings and appurtenances to the appurten-
ances thereof situate at Lyminge in the parish of Saint Martin afforesaid unto my
said two children the said John Tillotson and Louisa Dixons to whom the said
and abovesame for ever as tenants in common and not as joint tenants subject nevertheless
to the payment of the said sum of ten pounds to the said John Tillotson
Robson first before accounted to my executors and trustees to leave my Table
Cloth or curtain to the value of one pound and also all the rest and residue of my estate and
effects whatsoever I may die possessed of notwithstanding my executors or trustees
decease and bequeath the same unto John Darter Esq: and my executors Samuel Dixons
thereunto and abovesame upon his or her death and lastly I do hereby
nominal receipt and affording the said John Darter Esq: and my executors Samuel
Dixons executors of this my will reciting all former and other will or wills
and vesting this to my last will and Testament on witness recited of the said
George Robson the Testator have left this my last will and Testament set my hand and
seal this fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
ninety two / Suse Robson / H. Benjamin Bull Goodman / F. Frederic Thorpe /
Robert Edis Esq: witness to the above will.

Appealed personally, Daniel Smith of Chaptown Common in the County
of Essex wife of Richard multy attorney and Surveyor of the same place witness and
made oath that they have and were well acquainted with George Robson late of the
Petborought in the County of Southampton. Whom she knew for sometime before and
up to the time of his death and also with his manner and character of handwriting
and subscription having several times seen his name and signature and subscribe ther
name to writings and having seen care fully written and perused the paper writing
whereunto annexed purporting to be and contain the last will and Testament of the
said deceased and having particularly observed the following memorandum to wit
that the sum of ten pounds can be accepted by my executors John Darter Esq:

of the sheet of paper containing the said last will and Testament of the said deceased

This is the last Will

and Testament of me Benjamin Rodgers
of the township of Bromhall in the parish of Chancles in the County palatine of
Lancaster being weak in body but of sound and disposing mind firste commend my soul
to God who gave it and my body to be buried in a private and funeral manner at the ex-
ecution of my executors hereinafter named. I order and direct all my just debts and ex-
traneous expenses to be paid by my son Francis Rodgers upon trust all my monies
debts and chasd goods and furnishing goods Linen plate and all other my personal estate
and effects of what nature or kind soever to be employed and expended for the use intent and
purpose of the support and comfort of this executrix my dear wife Elizabeth Rodgers during
the rem^r of her natural life and for that purpose she is hereby empowered with full power
to sell or dispose of all or any part thereof at her discretion and after the death of my said
wife to divide as equally as can be done either by mutual agreement or sale rottrever
may remain of the property above described between herself and his brother John
for their own use and benefit that property remaining stands in these funds in my name as
surviving Trustee only except certaine chasd to be applied agreeable to the deeds and for
the purpose for certaine truste intituled to me and no other and lastly make nominate
trustee and appoint my said son Francis Rodgers sole Executor of this my will and do
hereby recte and make void all former wills by me made in witness whereof I have
set my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of November one thousand
eight hundred and forty one & Benjamin Rodgers signed sealed published and declared
by the testator as and for this last will and Testament in the presence of us rottrever this
day and in this present place submited our names as witness to him "Wm. H.
Rich. Taylor." /
